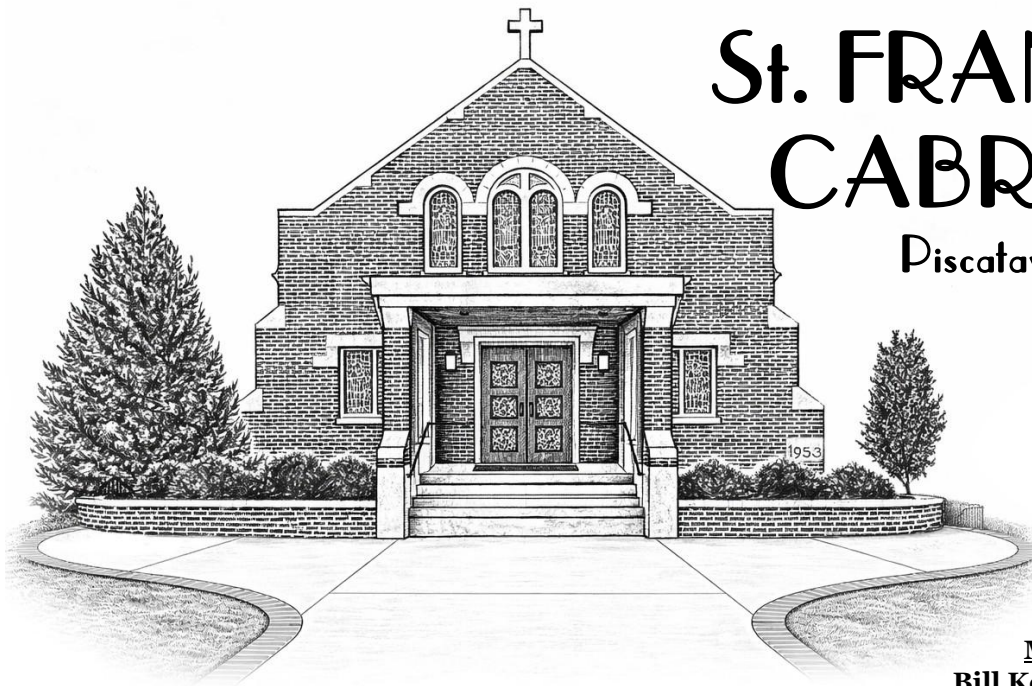

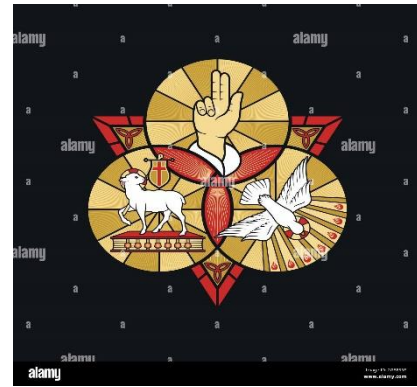
Parish Registration: Welcome to St. Frances Cabrini Church! New parishioners are asked to please register with us. You may do so by coming to the parish office during hours or calling the office manager & asking for a registration form to be mailed. Newly married couples need to re-register as a family even if you grew up in the parish. Please notify the parish office upon a change of address, phone number or a move.

Baptism: Baptisms are celebrated on the first Sunday of the month immediately following the 11:30 Mass. Parents are required (& Godparents are encouraged) to attend a Baptismal Preparation Class **before the Baptism**. Please call the parish office to register for the class & the baptismal date. Parents & Godparents are both asked to attend the Sunday 11:30 Mass on the date of the Baptism.

Marriage: The Diocese of Metuchen requires a period of preparation for the Sacrament of Marriage. This includes sessions with the parish priest, **a Pre-Cana Class, a God's Plan for a Joy Filled Marriage Session & F.O.C.C.U.S. (an online values indicator.)** We ask that you contact the parish office one year in advance & **PLEASE CALL TO BE SURE YOUR WEDDING DATE IS AVAILABLE AT THE CHURCH BEFORE BOOKING A VENUE.** God Bless You on your engagement!

THE MOST HOLY TRINITY MAY 31, 2026

First Reading: Exodus 34:4b-6, 8-9

The Lord appears to Moses on Mount Sinai and proclaims to him that the Lord is a "merciful God...slow to anger and rich in kindness and fidelity."

Second Reading: 2 Corinthians 13:11-13

Paul exhorts the Corinthians to live in peace and harmony, and for the first time, invokes the Blessed Trinity.

Gospel: John 3:16-18

In this beautiful passage, Jesus tells Nicodemus that God loved his people so much that he "gave his only son." Jesus reveals to Nicodemus that anyone who believes in him will not die but will enjoy life with him for all eternity.

"Brothers and sisters, rejoice. Mend your ways, encourage one another, agree with one another, live in peace, and the God of love and peace will be with you... Greet one another with a holy kiss. All the holy ones greet you. The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with all of you."

How frequently each day we express our belief in the mystery of the Holy Trinity. Just think - I bless myself as I begin to pray. I reach for the blessed holy water, as I enter church. The priest begins our worship with both the sign of the cross and offers a greeting reflecting the Trinity. Throughout the Mass the same sign is used, and when we are sent and depart we receive a Trinitarian blessing.

I know my God as He reveals Himself to me. He is a creating Father, who made me because He knew and loved me from all eternity. He is a saving Redeemer, who came to rescue me, and shed His love in His Passion, death and resurrection. He is the abiding Spirit, who dwells in me, empowering me to live a holy life.

I love the question when asked: 'When you pray to whom do you address your prayer?'
